



Benefits

It is worth checking if you are eligible for payments from the 4 main providers for benefits:

- Department of Work & Pensions (DWP)
- HM Revenues & Customs (HMRC)
- Scottish Government
- Dundee City Council



DWP - Jobcentre Plus

- You are entitled to benefits if you become unemployed.
- You could also qualify for assistance from Rapid Response Team whilst still in employment.
- PACE can put you in direct contact with local Jobcentre staff or to make a benefit claim call:

HMRC - Tax Credits

- If your employment situation changes, you may be entitled to more tax credits.
- If you have a mixture of PAYE employment and self-employment, you should check you are not paying too much tax (tax code) when made redundant
