Successful Academy Secures Work For All Participants

For the first time the entire cohort of a skills academy in Dundee has been offered a contract with an employer. All eight of the clients who participated in the Discover Work Partnership academy with Social Security Scotland have been offered 12-month fixed term contracts starting over the next few weeks.

Discover Work brokered this unique arrangement with Social Security Scotland working with Discover Work Partners to deliver a tailored, intensive training course supported by the employer to help meet their requirements whilst also building the skills and confidence of all candidates who participated.

The course was unique in that Social Security Scotland delegated recruitment to the Partnership and removed their standard application process for the participants as part of the employers ongoing commitment to employ people from diverse backgrounds. Jack Reid, one of the people who took part in the academy said: "I have found this form of recruitment to be beneficial as it has given me the skills, confidence and knowledge to go into the role."

This Academy is the latest in a number of successful events with specific employers in which the Discover Work Partnership has worked with unemployed residents to support them back into the workforce.

Multi-lingual Abass supports others to achieve success

A participant on the Dundee Employability Pathway has taken up employment with the Adult Employability Service (AES) at Dundee City Council, supporting his fellow Ukrainians to find work in Dundee.

Abass, a dentist from Ukraine (pictured) first made contact with AES in May 2022, having left his life as a dentist in Ukraine due to the war.

Working with his Case Manager, Abass identified the steps he would need to take to be able to practice dentistry in Scotland, which could take several years.

Abass was very keen to find part-time employment while studying to achieve Scottish equivalents of his dentistry qualifications. AES recognised his advanced level of English and encouraged him to look at English/Ukrainian translation roles.

Abass was also interested in helping his fellow Ukrainians, many of whom are trying to find jobs in Dundee but with less English language than him, so he offered to volunteer as a translator for AES while they helped him find a job. The team were then able to create a paid position for Abass as a Ukrainian-speaking support worker.

"Having Abass translate is such a great help to AES because we can now deliver employability training courses to Ukrainian clients [...] He has has been a great help to the team and is doing well in the role, even delivering training himself to clients from Ukraine. He takes part in the weekly job shops to support Ukrainian clients apply for jobs." Said Senior Employability Officer of AES, Erin Johnson.

Abass said of his time with AES: ""I am really happy and find it very interesting meeting new people and hearing their stories. I had a lot of help to settle here and the team have been very friendly".

Dundee's Local Employability Partnership, Discover Work has coordinated an event that supported the <u>Social Care Careers Week</u> on Tuesday 6th December.

The event featured speakers from <u>NHS Tayside</u>, <u>Dundee City Council's Adult Employability</u> <u>Service (AES)</u>, <u>Dundee Health & Social Care Partnership (DHSCP)</u> and <u>Scottish Social</u> <u>Services Council (SSSC)</u>.

The event was aimed at employability practitioners to highlight the challenges and opportunities available in Dundee within this growth sector providing information on support that is available for potential candidates to encourage people to move into this sector.

Discover Work Partnership set the context for the day by presenting labour market information and analysis for the Tayside region's health & social care industry. The NHS Healthcare Academy focussed on their upcoming intake for January 2023, giving an opportunity for up to 15 individuals to gain employability support, accredited training and practical experience in health and social care settings. SSSC gave an overview of their soon to be launched toolkit, 'Ten Steps', created in collaboration with practitioners and other organisations, which aims to start the conversation about Care as an attractive and rewarding career. DHSCP discussed their recruitment process and current vacancies, and Dundee City Council's Adult Employability Service showcased their 'Discover Care' course planned for January 2023.
