More employability support for Dundee parents launched



<u>All in Dundee</u> has broadened its reach to <u>support parents</u> in Dundee, with additional partners now involved in providing employment support and guidance to parents who are unemployed or underemployed. Through a network of key workers and a comprehensive range of programmes <u>Street League</u> and <u>Helm</u> join <u>ENABLE Works</u>, <u>One</u> <u>Parent Families Scotland</u>, <u>Barnardo's</u> and <u>Volunteering Matters</u> to empower parents in achieving sustainable employment. They address practical concerns such as upskilling, childcare, and living expenses and offer solutions to help with a smooth transition into work.

Parents can take advantage of a wealth of resources and expert guidance through the All in Dundee and wider <u>Discover Work partnership</u> including flexible training funds, one to one mentorship, social/wellbeing groups, employability training workshops, and employer led academies. Rosealie invests in her family's future with help from OPFS



A Dundee mum has made brave decisions and overcome substantial challenges to achieve her personal goals with the help of One Parent Families Scotland (OPFS). Rosealie is a single parent with two young sons who both have additional needs. Incredibly, she is now 6 months into a new job, has moved house and is around £1600 better off per month.

Rosealie and her key worker at OPFS worked gradually to develop an action plan that includes building confidence and managing the factors that put strain on her mental health, with the aim of moving onto education then employment at the right time for her. Rosalie took part in informal online training available though the Employability Pathway, helping her to build confidence and the appetite to take on further opportunities. Like most people, Rosealie had ups and downs on her journey, and when facing multiple challenges at once, it is easy to be overwhelmed. However, with flexible and personcentred support from OPFS, Rosealie overcame the setbacks, adapted her career plans and kept moving forward.

A key part of Rosalie's journey was taking part in OPFS's groups where she met other parents. Through sharing her knowledge and experience with others, Rosealie began to recognise her own achievements and positive attributes. Having confidence in herself and using her life experience as an asset helped Roslie to start job searching in earnest, which OPFS were well-placed to help with.

Making the brave decision to move home and accept a job with the local council, Rosalie feels her whole life has changed:

"The support I got from OPFS was incredible, I really doubted myself after years of being just at home with the children. You made me realise I have lots of transferrable skills. I would definitely recommend you to any single parent considering or looking for work"

The support and opportunities have been fantastic throughout, and the training and experience gained from the training course has proved invaluable in this."



Spotlight Project

Employer-Led Academies

Dundee and Angus College in partnership with Discover Work partners, have pioneered an innovative approach to combatting unemployment and skills gaps within our region through offering unique and individualised employment academies in collaboration with local businesses.

The initiative goes beyond the realms of traditional training programmes, providing participants with the opportunity to develop technical skills onsite at D&A whilst accomplishing personal growth and fostering a growth mindset in collaboration with employability partners. In a region experiencing high unemployment rates and skills gaps, D&A established positive partnerships with local businesses as a solution to develop individuals and enhance businesses. Our tailor-made academies in collaboration with Discover Work partners connect with local businesses to train unemployed individuals to develop the skills to thrive in growing industries. The academies have reached individuals in our community who have long been disengaged, socially excluded, and faced various health and wellbeing challenges and empowered them to successfully gain a sense of self and regain confidence and resilience along the way. The academies focus on developing technical and personal skills and empowering individuals for success.

The Academies, hosted at Dundee and Angus College, are an intensive six-week programme which provides simulated real-world working environments, providing practical experiences and technical skills utilising the expertise and knowledge of our academic teams. This combined with the employability skills delivered by our Discover Work partners is preparing and equipping participants

for the job market through developing interview skills, CV writing and presentation skills to prepare the students for the job search process. Our strong collaborations with Discover Work partners and local employers have fostered a collective effort to tackle unemployment and each academy concludes with a celebration event, recognising the partnerships and the impact on each of the individuals enrolled on our academies.

Sharing Best Practice



A prime example of the employability academies is the manufacturing <u>academy in</u> <u>partnership with Discovery Flexibles</u>, a print manufacturing business with a turnover of 13 million and Discover Work partners. For two years, the business had been struggling with recruitment, but through the collaboration between D&A and Discover Work, a customised and tailored academy was able to address the skills gap and transform the lives of the individuals enrolled as well as bridge the employment gap for the business.

We worked closely with Discovery Flexibles to thoroughly understand their needs as a business and the skills they required from employees to grow their business. As a result of the consultation and co-design process, a tailored engineering academy was created to align with their requirements. Working in complete partnership with our Discover Work partners we were able to provide the technical skills bolstered by employability skills that simulated the working environment and hours to provide real-world experiences for participants and provide the business with individuals who were fully committed to their success.

Impact

The impact of the engineering academy is clearly outlined in the outcomes achieved through the multi-layered partnership approach with Discovery Flexibles. Out of the 15 unemployed participants, 9 individuals successfully completed the academy and three of them were offered full-time permanent employment opportunities with Discovery Flexibles. The partnership between D&A and Discover Work has not only provided individuals with the opportunity to grow their practical and technical skills to enter the job market it has empowered them with employable skills and a growth mindset for competing in growing sectors. It has allowed individuals to secure permanent employment and provided transformative experiences for both individuals and businesses.

We intend to broaden the programme's scope by replicating the success of these academies in other sectors such as hospitality, tourism and automotive. We are further widening the programme's scope through contributions to sustainability and environmental benefits by offering academies that empower individuals to contribute to their communities through learning and progressing with sustainable future technologies.
